The Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) completed a Federal Aviation Regulation (FAR) Part 150 Noise Study for Waterbury-Oxford Airport in October 2008. In compliance with federal requirements, the Department is currently preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to evaluate and document the environmental impacts associated with the recommendations of the FAR Part 150 Noise Study.

As a component of the EA, the Department is surveying property owners and residents to gather information relevant to your relocation needs and concerns, as well as to understand your interest in participating in a noise mitigation program. The information enclosed is being sent to all owners on record that own homes in the designated program area, per the local tax records.

One of the recommended land use strategies being considered to mitigate airport noise impacts is through a voluntary program to acquire homes within the Triangle Hills neighborhood, per the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisitions Policies Act of 1970, as amended. Relocation assistance would be provided to owners and tenants if the owners participate in the acquisition program. The implementation of the recommended strategies would be reliant on the availability of federal and state funds.

Your property has been identified as one of those parcels that may be eligible to participate in a voluntary acquisition program. Additional information about this program will be provided in the future. Providing the information requested in this survey is optional. However, your participation in this survey will greatly assist the Department to understand any needs and concerns you may have. The initial plan is being coordinated by Clough Harbour & Associates (CHA) and O. R. Colan Associates (ORC) on behalf of the Department. ORC specializes in airport acquisition programs across the country, and their staff will be available to assist you through the preliminary survey process and answer your questions related to the mitigation program. It is important to understand that implementation of the recommended noise mitigation strategies will be pursued as federally subsidized projects, and will be initiated and completed contingent upon receipt of future funding.

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) completed a Federal Aviation Regulation (FAR) Part 150 Noise Study for Waterbury-Oxford Airport in October 2008. In compliance with federal requirements, the Department is currently preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to evaluate and document the environmental impacts associated with the recommendations of the FAR Part 150 Noise Study.

As a component of the EA, the Department is surveying property owners and residents to gather information relevant to your relocation needs and concerns, as well as to understand your interest in participating in a noise mitigation program. The information enclosed is being sent to all owners on record that own homes in the designated program area, per the local tax records.

One of the recommended land use strategies being considered to mitigate airport noise impacts is through a voluntary program to acquire homes within the Triangle Hills neighborhood, per the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, as amended. A second recommended strategy includes reducing noise for affected residences through sound insulation or by implementing other soundproofing measures. A number of the homes may be offered the option to participate in either a voluntary acquisition program or soundproofing program, while the others may be given the option to participate in a voluntary acquisition program only. Relocation assistance would be provided to owners and tenants if the owners participate in the voluntary acquisition program. The implementation of both recommended strategies would be reliant on the availability of federal and state funds.

Your property has been identified as one of those parcels that may be eligible to participate in a voluntary acquisition program or sound insulation program. Because your property is not located in the Runway Protection Zone, you will have two mitigation options to consider:

- A. Remain in your home and be offered sound insulation measures that may reduce interior noise to acceptable levels. Such measures may include replacement of windows, doors, siding, roofs, air conditioning systems, etc. or
- B. Participate in a Voluntary Acquisition Program as described in the attached FAA Voluntary Land Acquisition and Relocation Assistance Program Overview.

Additional information about both programs will be provided in the future. Providing the information requested in the survey is optional. However, your participation in this survey will

greatly assist the Department to understand any needs and concerns that you may have. The initial plan is being coordinated by Clough Harbour & Associates (CHA) and O. R. Colan Associates (ORC) on behalf of the Department. ORC specializes in airport acquisition programs across the country, and their staff will be available to assist you through the preliminary survey process and answer your questions related to the mitigation program. It is important to understand that implementation of the recommended noise mitigation strategies, including the Voluntary Land Acquisition Program and Sound Insulation Program, will be pursued as federally subsidized projects, and will be initiated and completed contingent upon receipt of future funding.
